Located in northwestern Romania, Maramureş borders on Ukraine and features the Rodnei, Țibleş and Gutâi Mountains. The region abounds in cultural and natural attractions and craft traditions. It is known for its many wooden churches-eight of which have been declared World Heritage sites by UNESCO-its numerous museums and bustling local markets, There visitors have the pleasant sensation of being far removed from modern times, and folklore enthusiasts find unparalleled authenticity and ethnographic richness.

Maramureş is the realm of Christian festivities and age-old celebrations. Time isn't measured in months, weeks or hours. Instead people speak of the time to sow, Lent, Easter, the harvest, Advent and Christmas celebrations.

Typical of dances from Maramureş are small steps, syncopated stamps (tropotit) and clapping (bătăi din palme). Very often the dances are enlivened by melodious shouts called ṭipurituri.

De horit means "song to dance to".
