# DEBKA HASHALOM

(Israel)

Choreographed by Rivka Sturma in 1968, and considered a classic Israeli dance. Although the name says "debka" this has no steps typically seen in a debka. It has the name because of the words to the song (see lyrics).

Translation: Debka of Peace

Formation: Lines of dancers facing CCW, hands joined and down.

# Part I Walk, brush, walk, stamp Meas. Step forward on R (ct 1); step forward on L (ct 2) Brush R foot fwd (ct 1); brush right foot back across R (ct &); brush R foot forward (ct 2); leap forward onto R (ct &) Step forward on R (ct 1); step forward on L (ct 2) Step forward on L and turn 1/4 to L (ct 1); stamp R without weight next to L (ct 2). Turn 1/4 to R to face LOD and repeat meas. 1-4 \*\* SEE NOTE regarding

# Part II Skip, slide, skip, stamp Meas.

- Step forward on R (ct 1); hop on R (ct &); step forward on L (ct 2); hop on L and turn 1/4 to L (ct &)
- Wide step on R to R (ct 1); step on L next to R (ct &); wide step on R to R and turn 1/4 R to face LOD (ct 2)
- 3 Step forward on L (ct 1); hop on L (ct &); step forward on R (ct 2); hop on R L (ct &)
- Step forward on L (ct 1); hop on L (ct &); turn 1/4 to L and close R next to L without weight (ct 2)
- 5-8 Turn 1/4 to R to face LOD and repeat meas. 1-4

sequence at end regarding Meas. 8

## Part III Step-hop, step

#### Meas.

- Facing LOD, step forward on R (ct 1); hop on R (ct &); step forward on L (ct 2); turn 1/4 to L to face center (ct &)
- Facing and moving toward center, step forward on R (ct 1); hop on R (ct &); step forward on L (ct 2)
- Facing center but backing away from center, step <u>backward</u> on R (ct 1); hop on R (ct &); step on L <u>backward</u> (ct 2); turn 1/4 to R to face LOD (ct &)
- Repeat Meas.1, counts 1-2 (do not turn to face center)
- 5-7 Repeat meas. 1-3
- Step forward on L (ct 1); step forward on R (ct 2)
- 9 Step forward on L (ct 1); step forward on R (ct 2)

- 10 Step forward on L (ct 1); step forward on R (ct 2)
- 11 Step forward on L (ct 1); stamp R next to L twice (ct 2 &)

SEQUENCE: The dance is done twice as noted above. Between the SECOND and THIRD time through the dance there is a musical bridge without lyrics. During this bridge, Part I is done EXCEPT that meas. 8 has two more steps (R, L) before the two stamps. Then the dance is repeated once more from the beginning.

Knowing this idiosyncracy is evidence of an experienced dancer who knows this dance well! The leader will frequently whistle or wave a hand to remind followers that this is the bridge and to pay attention.
